### Other data

Six hundred sixty-one (661) students were processed for working papers in 2007-08 (600 in 2006-07 and 732 in 2005-06).

Of the 985 students new to the district, 975 were properly immunized and 10 are in process, or have a religious or medical exemption.

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The strengths of this program are the consistency of health care available at all times and the excellent health resource provided for the school community.
- The school nurses continue to serve on the Crisis Response Teams in their schools.

## **HEALTH SERVICES** (cont.)

- During the summer months a school nurse worked in the central registrar office to verify health records. This process allowed students to be registered more efficiently.
- The flexibility of a substitute nurse to provide additional assistance for screenings, data entry into infinite campus and health office procedures.
- The staff and administrators feel comfortable in utilizing the Health Offices both for the health needs of the students and themselves.
- On workshop day the nursing staff updated their CPR/AED training.
- More nurses were hired for the district substitute list and the hours for the health office assistant were increased at Shaker Junior High School.
- The nurses continue to train faculty and staff in the use of epi-pens and giving care for a choking victim.
- The health services staff has members on both the HIV/AIDS Advisory Council and on the District Wellness Committee.
- Monthly department meetings have become an opportunity to discuss issues and help keep continuity with regards to health office policy and procedures.

## **OBJECTIVE**

- Implement the health information component, Infinite Campus, to provide medical information for the school nurses.

Evaluation: Were procedures developed to facilitate implementation of the system?

The computers in all health offices have been updated or replaced so that Infinite Campus can be used. The nurses have developed information which has been added to the health module for use in our district. During the March workshop the school nurses received Infinite Campus training specific to the health module. The nurses have begun data input for student's immunizations and health screenings.
