

BEHAVIOR CODE AND ATTENDANCE POLICY

Although Driver Education is a non-credit course, it is still a Shaker High School offering and the same behavioral expectations are in place. Additionally, any intentional act that threatens the safety of students, instructors, or the community at large will be grounds for immediate removal from the program with forfeiture of any fees paid.

Department of Motor Vehicle and the State Education Department regulations allow for no more than two absences from class and driving. Orientation counts as your first class and is mandatory. These absences should be used in the case of illness. The only excused absences are college entrance exams (e.g. SAT, ACT). Provisions will be made to make up missed work. Sports, clubs and school trips may be important, but are not excused absences from driver education. They are additional choices that we all make. Make the choice before making the commitment to driver education. If you have many other commitments, driver education must become a top commitment. Otherwise, you will be better served by waiting for a more convenient time.
